SWITCHBACK WILL PERFORM ON THE TPAC STAGE



The "inventive" Bill Carrothers up-to-the-minute piano style has echoes of hard-bop and post-bop masters, of course, with his own spin.




Soon they were recording and performing consistently throughout the Midwest.



THE WASHINGTON ISLAND MUSIC FESTIVAL

Working with Stephen Colburn, a part-time resident of Washington Island and retired principal oboist for the Milwaukee Symphony, and his wife, Marlee Sabo, Voice Department Chair, Wisconsin Conservatory of Music, the Washington Island Art and Nature Center (ANC) initiated a program in 1991 to provide classical music performance, education and appreciation opportunities and experiences for the Washington Island community.



The Music Festival Activities have included sponsoring a summer music festival which has brought 12-16 musicians to Washington Island for each of the last 21 years from distinguished musical organizations, including the Milwaukee, Manitowoc,

and Colorado Symphonies, and the Wisconsin Conservatory of Music. Initially these summer concerts were presented for a week at various venues on the Island.




In 1996 the summer festival was expanded to two weeks. Island talent was recruited for the integration of an Island Festival Chorus of 15-30 voices into the Music Festival Activities. Question and answer periods were added, led by Samantha George, violinist and Associate Professor of Music at Lawrence University. During the second week, a children's music camp is conducted by summer resident and music educator, Kari Gordon.

Perhaps the most growth has been in the "Music in the School" program at the Washington Island School under the direction Donna Briesemeister, as successor to Dan Hansen who has recently retired.



MOVIES


Last year the TPAC also made arrangements to present first run movies using its new screen and projector (thanks to a generous gift in memory of bill Olson).



Ordinance 2013-02

Town of Washington
Door County
State of Wisconsin

1) **Title and Purpose**

The Title of this ordinance of the Town of Washington All-Terrain and Utility Vehicle Road Ordinance. The purpose of this ordinance is to establish all-terrain and utility vehicle roads and to regulate the operation of all-terrain and utility vehicles in the town.

2) **Authority**

The Town Board of the Town of Washington, Door County, Wisconsin, has the specific authority to adopt this all-terrain / utility vehicle ordinance under state statute 23.33(8)(b) and (11), 59.02 Wisconsin Statutes.

3) **Adoption of Ordinance**

This ordinance adopted on proper notice with a quorum and roll call vote by a majority of the town board present and voting provides the authority for the town to designate roads for all-terrain / utility vehicles and to regulate their use.

4) **Operation of All-Terrain and Utility Vehicles**

Pursuant to statute 23.33 (4)(d) 4., Wis. Statutes, except as otherwise provided in statute 23.33 (4) Wisconsin statutes, no person may operate an all-terrain / utility vehicle on a roadway portion of any highway in the town except on roadways that are designated as all-terrain / utility vehicle roads by this ordinance. Operation of all-terrain / utility vehicle on a roadway in the town that is an all-terrain / utility vehicle road is authorized only for the extreme right side of the roadway except that left turns may be made from any part of the roadway that is safe given prevailing conditions.

5) **Designation of All-terrain / Utility Vehicle Roads**

All Town roads (not including private roads or County Highways) are designated as all-terrain / utility vehicle roads in the Town.

6) **Conditions Applicable to All-Terrain / Utility Vehicle Roads**

Pursuant to statute 23.33 (8)(d), Wisconsin statutes, the following restrictions are placed on the use of the town all-terrain / utility vehicle roads designated by this ordinance:

- a) Operation shall be subject to all provisions of statute 23.33, Wisconsin Statutes, which are, adopted as a part of this ordinance by reference, pursuant to statute 23.33 (11), Wisconsin statutes.
 - b) A copy of this ordinance shall be sent by the town clerk to the Door County Sheriff's Department and the Department of Natural Resources.
 - c)
 1. All ATV / UTV operators shall observe a speed limit of 25 miles Per hour or applicable speed limits of the roads set forth in Chapter 64, Wisconsin Administrative Code, which ever is lower.
 2. All ATV / UTV operators shall ride single file.
 3. All ATV / UTV operators shall slow the vehicle to 10 mph or less when operating within 150 feet of a dwelling.
 4. ATV / UTV operators are required to display a lighted headlight (white light) and tail lamp (red light) on the ATV / UTV.
 5. No person under the age of 12 can operate an ATV / UTV under and Circumstances.
 6. All ATV / UTV vehicles must remain on the right side of the paved portion of the roadway.
- 7) **Enforcement**

Any law enforcement officer authorized to enforce the laws of the State of Wisconsin may enforce this ordinance.

8) **Penalties**

The penalties under statute 23.33 (13)(a), Wisconsin statutes are adopted by reference.

9) **Severability**

If any provision of this ordinance or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the validity does not effect other provisions or applications of this ordinance that can be given effect without the invalid

provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are severable.

10) **Effective Date**

This ordinance is effective on publication or posting, however ATV / UTV vehicles will not be allowed on Town or County road ways until all signage is properly completed.

The town clerk shall properly publish this ordinance as required under state statute 60.80 of the Wisconsin statutes.

Preface

This deposit schedule was adopted by the Wisconsin Judicial Conference pursuant to authority contained in Section 345.26(2)(a), Wisconsin Statutes. This schedule is divided into two sections: Section I – Deposit Schedule for Forfeiture Actions and Section II – Bond Schedule for Criminal Actions.

Violations listed in Section II of the schedule must be brought in the name of the State of Wisconsin and treated for all purposes as any other criminal matter.

Where no bond or deposit is established by this schedule for a traffic violation, bond should be set at one-half of the maximum monetary penalty provided by law.

In a forfeiture matter, if a penalty is not set forth, see Section 939.61(1), Wisconsin Statutes, which provides a forfeiture not to exceed \$200.

In a criminal matter, if a penalty is not set forth, see Section 939.61(2), Wisconsin Statutes, which provides a penalty of \$0-\$500 and/or up to 30 days where no other penalty is provided.

This version of the schedule contains demerit point assignments for certain traffic offenses. In situations where no demerit points are assessed and there is a question whether a conviction for a certain violation will appear on the driver record, the Department of Transportation should be contacted for verification. Persons who hold a probationary license, instruction permit, or no license at all, will be assessed the regular number of demerit points for their first conviction. Points will be doubled for second and subsequent convictions except for convictions under Chapter 347.

SECTION I Uniform Wisconsin Schedule for Deposit or Cash Bail Traffic Offenses

(Costs additional – where applicable)

Minimum and maximum penalties for each offense are indicated in parentheses. All offenses designated in Section II as crimes are misdemeanors with imprisonment in the county jail unless indicated as a felony offense.

For violations of Chapter 23, All-Terrain Vehicles, and of Chapter 350, Snowmobile Violations, by juveniles 14 or 15 years of age, the total deposit amount shall consist of the deposit plus court costs. No surcharges are to be added. Juveniles 16 or 17 years of age are treated as adults for all-terrain vehicle and snowmobile violations.
