The Department would like to inform you that grants from the Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program have been tentatively awarded to support the acquisition of three parcels in the Town of Washington by Door County Land Trust for conservation and public recreational purposes. The parcels are 3 acres, 3 acres, and 1 acre in size.

State law includes a provision requiring a Department notice to your Board stating that your Board may adopt a resolution that supports or opposes land acquisitions funded by the Stewardship Program - see s. 23.0917(5t) Wis. As the Town prepares the 2014 budget, the Door County Humane Society sincerely requests a donation for the care of stray and homeless animals from Washington. We accept every lost dog or cat from Door County, and take the responsibility very seriously. However, each year we must deal with the formidable gap between municipal donations and the number of animals that come from that location. Enclosed is the 2013 YTD summary of stray animals from Washington. The cost of care calculation is:

- Number of stray animals x 8 days each (WI Statute) x \$15/day

The financial burden of caring for lost dogs and cats is a real concern. We receive less than 5% of our total budget from government sources but we need help from every municipality. Our team of staff, volunteers, and members is dedicated to reuniting animal companions with their owners or finding them permanent adoptive homes. In 2012, Washington contributed \$200 to the Humane Society - thank you!

Through private donations over the past three years, we were able to complete an expansion to the shelter so that each animal is housed in safe, humane conditions and staff members can perform their tasks with optimum efficiency. We hope you will attend our grand opening on September 21st, or come for a personal tour at a time convenient for you.

A petition for a **Conditional Use** for tax parcel #028-02-36342944A2 for an assembly hall to host special events located at 1309 Rangeline Road.

After discussion using the **GENERAL CRITERIA REGARDING ZONING HEARING CASES IN DOOR COUNTY** at our November 6, 2013 WIZAP meeting we recommend approval of the Conditional Use request.

Motion by L. Holmes, 2nd by C. Stayton to bring the conditional use request to the floor. Under discussion it was pointed out that when the existing building was refurbished there was no ordinance established that applied to an assembly hall.

Following the General Criteria by which to evaluate conditional use permit applications, the committee determined that:

- The project would not negatively affect the Public Interest or the Town's interest.
- The project would not negatively affect public health, safety, and welfare.
- The project would not negatively affect the character of the surrounding area.
- The project is an allowed use in a Mixed Commercial area with a conditional use.

In our evaluations we agreed with the applicant's answers on the application form **with the following recommendation from the committee---**

That the number of parking spaces be increased due to the necessity of on-street parking during certain events, thus creating hazardous conditions for traffic on Townline and Rangeline Roads. This also has the potential of making it more difficult for fire trucks to get into the building with the added congestion of cars parked on the roads.

Motion by M. Kickbush, 2nd by ML Benson to recommend approval of the conditional use proposed by Willscott Properties LLC for an assembly hall to host special events on parcel #028-02-36342944A2 located at 1309 Rangeline Road with the additional recommendation to add parking spaces.

Roll call vote: MLBenson-yes, K. Foss-yes, J. Goodwin-yes, L. Holmes-yes, M. Kickbush-yes, C. Stayton-yes. **Motion carried** unanimously.

At our November 6, 2013 WIZAP meeting we discussed a **Door Co. Zoning Ordinance Text Amendment** changing the number of days that a temporary use is permitted, the definition & how the days are counted.

Motion by M. Kickbush, 2nd by K. Foss that **Washington Island** recommend not changing the ordinance and that the county should limit any changes to Liberty Grove (where a complaint originated from). **Motion carried** unanimously.

This has never been an issue on the island and we may even consider it desirable for someone to establish a temporary use to create and enhance commerce for a period of up to 10 days. Further, such limitations may be cause for future rezoning requests because of the limitation it may place on a “serious” agri-tourism type of event.
