Wet Garbage for the Compactor

Kitchen waste	Anti-freeze containers	Plastic bags
Soiled paper	Diapers	Broken glass
Oil cans	Aerosol cans	Light bulbs
Bottle caps	Plastic containers #3 thru #7	glass or ceramic dishes
Latex paints w/o cover and dry		

Paper and Cardboard for Paper Compactor

Newspapers – including inserts	Books – soft and hard covered
Magazines	Writing paper
Corrugated cardboard – flattened	Computer print-outs
Non-corrugated cardboard – flattened (remove plastic liners and food residue)	Copier paper
Catalogs	Construction paper
Envelopes	Grocery bags
	Junk mail

Recyclable Bottles and Containers Mixed Together – Remove caps and rinse. Labels may be left on. **No oil or anti-freeze containers.** Aluminum cans recycled separately.

All glass bottles and jars
Steel or bi-metal cans (flattened), clean aluminum pie pans, clean foil
Plastic soda bottles, milk and water jugs (flattened)
Plastic containers coded #1 or #2

Metal Pile – scrap metal, fencing, fee items, etc., see attendant before dumping

Not Accepted – motor oil (check at Dave's Garage or Shipyard Island Marina); oil based paint cans w/paint; chemicals and corrosive materials.

Door County conducts a hazardous waste disposal on the Island every three years.
